QF739, Sydney to Adelaide, 8 May 2019



Every inflight item will be composted, reused or recycled.



1000 single-use plastic items removed or substituted from flight.



QF739 normally generates 34kg of waste.

Qantas Partner BioPak's sustainable products include



Paper BioCups

with plastic made from plant matter, not oil. Fully compostable.



BioNapkins

made with Forest Stewardship Council certified pulp. Fully compostable.



BioCane food container

made from sugar cane pulp left over from refineries. Fully compostable.



BioPlastic cutlery

produced from starch sourced from non-GMO crops.

Qantas partner SUEZ will dispose of items sustainably

COMPOSTING



Organic material is shredded and kept moist for months.



Micro-organisms are released to break down material.



Final product used on farms, in factories and in gardens.

RECYCLING AND REUSE



Plastic, paper, glass and aluminium packaging will be recycled into new products.



Non-recyclable plastics transformed into a type of non-fossil fuel called PEF, used in cement making.
